### Readings for The Baptism of the Lord

#### **First Reading**

Isaiah 40:1-5,9-11 (The first reading from Cycle A may also be chosen, Isaiah 42:1-4,6-7.) Isaiah tells the people to prepare a way for the Lord.

#### **Responsorial Psalm**

Psalm 104:1b-4,24-25,27-30 (The psalm from Cycle A may also be chosen, Psalm 29:1-2,3-4,9-10.) A prayer praising God's greatness.

#### Second Reading

Titus 2:11-14; 3:4-7 (The second reading from Cycle A may also be chosen, Acts of the Apostles 10:34-38.) Jesus Christ saved us and renewed us with his Holy Spirit.

**Gospel Reading** Luke 3:15-16,21-22 Jesus is baptized by John.

Today we celebrate the feast of the Baptism of the Lord. In today's Gospel, as in the other Gospel accounts of Jesus' baptism, we hear John the Baptist address the confusion of the people who thought that John might be the Messiah. In response, John contrasts the baptism that he performs with the Baptism that Jesus will inaugurate. John the Baptist says that he has baptized with water, but that someone will come and baptize with the Holy Spirit. The type of baptism that John performed was not yet a Christian Baptism; it was a preparation for Christian Baptism through which sins are forgiven and the gift of the Holy Spirit is received.

### TO THE CLERGY, CONSECRATED RELIGIOUS AND LAY FAITHFUL OF THE DIOCESE OF LAS CRUCES

It is with great joy that the Diocese of Las Cruces joins with the Universal Church in celebrating the Jubilee Year of Hope 2025. The Jubilee Year was announced earlier by the Holy Father, Pope Francis on May 9, 2024. He has chosen as a theme for the Holy Year "Hope Does Not Disappoint" taken from St. Paul's letter to the Romans (Rm 5:5). Pope Francis observed "Everyone knows what it is to hope. In the heart of each person, hope dwells as the desire and expectation of good things to come, despite our not knowing what the future may bring (Pope Francis, "*Spes non confundit*," Bull of Indiction of the Ordinary Jubilee of the Year 2025, May 9, 2024).

The Jubilee tradition is based in sacred scripture, particularly in the Book of Leviticus, where the Lord commands His people to celebrate a year of release, restoration, and renewal every fifty years. It was a time for debts to be forgiven, slaves to be set free, land to be restored to its rightful owners -- a tangible expression of God's mercy and forgiveness. It was a way to "reset" matters to their original state; in our case, to return the soul to the state of grace it was in when it received baptism.

Jubilee Year is one of supreme mercy and forgiveness, the Church is providing even more opportunities of spiritual cleansing through this Jubilee Plenary Indulgence.

The normal conditions to receive an indulgence are:

- (1) sacramental confession;
- (2) reception of holy communion; and
- (3) prayers for the intention of the Holy Father.

Finally, this year's plenary indulgence may be obtained more than the usual once in a day, and the second one may be applied only to a deceased person — which can be a great way to pray for the souls in purgatory.
