Readings for the 10th Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading - Genesis 3:9-15: God confronts Adam and Eve after they eat from the forbidden tree. They blame each other and the serpent, who is then cursed by God.

Responsorial Psalm - Psalm 130: I cry out to You, Lord, from the depths of my despair, seeking Your mercy and redemption, trusting in Your forgiveness and promise to deliver me from all my sins.

Second Reading - 2 Corinthians 4:13-5:1: We speak from faith, confident that as God raised Jesus, He will also raise us. Despite physical decline, our spirits renew, focusing on eternal, unseen glory.

Gospel - Mark 3:20-35: Jesus teaches that his true family includes those who do God's will, despite accusations from scribes and concerns from his biological family. He emphasizes unity and the power of faith over division.

On the 10th Sunday in Ordinary Time, we see God confronting Adam and Eve after their disobedience in the Garden of Eden. They had eaten the forbidden fruit, and now they faced the consequences. God tells them what will happen because of their actions, but He also gives a promise.

In Genesis 3:9-15, God speaks of an offspring who will crush the serpent's head. This points to Jesus, who will overcome sin and death. Despite their disobedience, there is hope for the future. God's promise shows His love and mercy.

This story reminds us that sin has consequences. When we disobey God, it affects our lives. But God's promise of redemption is always there. He never leaves us without hope.

El primer efecto del pecado es la esclavitud: quien peca «se ha hecho esclavo de aquello por lo que se ha decidido, y se ha decidido por lo peor, por la ausencia de Dios». De ahí que el pecado suponga una ruptura con el Señor y con las personas que nos rodean. Esto es lo que ocurrió con Adán. El pecado le acabó alejando de aquellos a quienes más quería. Tiene miedo de Dios, y por eso se oculta de su presencia; mira con desconfianza a Eva, y por eso le echa la culpa y se desentiende de ella. Al pecar, cada uno de nosotros se aleja de la felicidad para la que habíamos sido creados y queda dañada la armonía con Dios, con nosotros mismos y con las personas que más nos importan.

San Josemaría consideraba el pecado como el peor de los males que hay que «temer» y «evitar con la gracia divina», pues nos aparta de la felicidad que nos da la relación con el Señor y los demás. «Reciamente, con sinceridad, hemos de sentir –en el corazón y en la cabeza– horror al pecado grave. Y también ha de ser nuestra la actitud, hondamente arraigada, de abominar del pecado venial deliberado, de esas claudicaciones que no nos privan de la gracia divina, pero debilitan los cauces por los que nos llega»
